Gather

Leader: We light a candle for God the Creator,

All: who lit the light in the darkness and breathed life into the creation

A candle is lit.

Leader: We light a candle to Jesus Christ,

All: the light of the world, our hope and rescue.

A candle is lit

Leader: We light a candle to the Holy Spirit,

All: who sets our faith on fire and gives us courage to follow the truth

A candle is lit

Leader: The heavens bear witness to your wonder:

All: Our lips shall proclaim your faithfulness*

Almighty God,

give us reverence for all creation and respect for every person, that we may mirror your likeness**

Prayerfully make a mirror tile mosaic with self-adhesive tiles from Baker Ross

Ask each congregation member to write or draw on a large pebble an element of creation they are thankful for and want to protect. Pray for commitment to action as each stone is then laid on a cairn pile

(Gently pour water into a bowl) God has chosen the rolling tide the flowing river the rushing stream the flooding burn to hold all of heaven and her promise (Pour water more fully into the bowl and let it overflow quite a bit) in the pouring and stirring and spilling and running comes the act of heaven and her promise (Scoop up water from the bowl and let it dribble through your fingers) so come and be soaked in the spirit as the story of salvation teems around us parables whispered in the drenching and baptism becomes the soothing rush of heaven and her promise of Jesus

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Read verses from the Message version of Psalm 148

> In bright light and dull darkness. In the energy of each day and the rest that comes with night We remember the goodness of God In the heavens high above our heads. In waters that run deep around the world We remember the goodness of God In solid land and flowing seas. In vivid flowers and fruit laden-trees We remember the goodness of God In the rising and setting of the sun and the cycles of the seasons. In the patterns of the shining stars We remember the goodness of God In oceans teeming with fish. In skies filled with birds We remember the goodness of God In a world filled with animal life. And in ourselves as human beings We remember the goodness of God And God looked and saw all that he had made, and indeed it was very, very good. In rest and reflection, in wonder and worship We remember the goodness of God. Amen**
