


Spiritual Styles

- Word-Centered Approach people of this style focus on their intellectual thinking of God through what they can touch, see and imagine.
- Emotion-Centered Approach places ones feelings at the core of spiritual experiences

- Symbol-Centered Approach people of this style put significant worth on the power of quiet, silence, listening and hearing, and 'connecting with and spending time with God so as to enjoy union with God'
- Action-Centered Approach these people believe that they need to do more than just pray for the world – they must actively and radically seek to transform it
