## God looks after Joseph

## **Genesis 37, 39**



Aim: To discover that God can be trusted even when things look bad



Joseph's story is worthy of any self-respecting soap opera. Sibling rivalry resulted in his being ambushed and sold as a slave in Egypt. He trusted God and honest labour and integrity led to him becoming the top man in the household. False accusations, however caused his downfall and an apparently unlimited prison term. Again, he trusted God and while still in jail,

he made a useful contact at Pharoah's court.

Joseph's life might have felt like a rollercoaster, but God looked after him just as he looks after us



Bring something to show that has a special meaning for you and explain what that is.

Our story today starts with Joseph showing off about his wonderful coat of many colours. One of the reasons he loved it so much was because it was from his Dad. But that was one of the reasons why his brothers were jealous of him and so cross about it



Use two paper plates - one with a smiley face and one with a sad face to help you tell the story. When Joseph is happy or the story talks about God show the happy face, and when the brothers are sad or angry show the sad face

Read 'Joseph and his brothers' (p34) and 'Joseph goes to Egypt' (p36)



- I wonder how Joseph felt when he was taken to Egypt.
- I wonder if he remembered his dreams that said that he would have an important job to do.
- I wonder where God is when I am facing difficult times.



Read 'Joseph's Jealous Brothers' (p25) and 'Off to prison' (p27) in Bob Hartman's 'Play along Bible'

Talk about how the different characters in the story must have felt. Explain that God is right in the middle of all these difficult feelings and cares about each and everyone of us
