## Jesus is born in Bethlehem Luke 2:1-7



## **FOR YOU**

The Bible doesn't actually say that Jesus was born in a stable, but we assume that it was some kind of animal shelter because he was laid in a manger - usually used for feeding horses and cattle hay. Jesus was not born in a palace or anywhere where you would expect to see royalty or celebrities and especially the Son of God! God chose this humble start to show that Jesus' birth is good news for all of us - whatever our circumstances - not reserved for those who can afford it. So, however we imagine it, whether it is a clean and cute stable, or something a bit more down to earth. Whether it is full of noisy animals (including the odd lobster) or quiet and peaceful it was an amazing start to Jesus' amazing life

## **STORY**



Show some things that you might have ready for a new baby's arrival and ask the parents to tell you where their babies were born and what they found the most useful when their baby arrived

In today's story we are going to hear about a special baby arriving in a very odd place



Read Jesus is born (p124). If you have props, then you can use those, if not show the picture on page 125 and ask everyone to point out the differences between that and the birth stories they showed earlier

I wonder what Mary and Joseph were feeling when they looked at Jesus' face for the first time?
